Purpose of the Meeting









- Receive input from interested agencies and the public on the environmental issues that the Draft EIR should address.
- The City has chosen to hold this meeting to enhance public participation as part of the project's review under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA).
- Today's meeting is NOT intended as a forum to discuss the merits of the proposed project. Merits of the project may be discussed at public hearings held to consider the project.



What is an EIR?









- An informational document describing the anticipated environmental effects of implementing a project, as required by CEQA.
- A forum for public participation in the environmental review process.
- An EIR includes mitigation measures to reduce potential adverse environmental impacts.
- An EIR does not advocate or promote the project.
- Certification of the EIR does not determine whether or not the project will be approved.



Environmental Review Process









- Notice of Preparation of the Draft EIR
 - Identifies environmental issues that will be addressed in the Draft EIR
 - 30-day public comment period
- Draft EIR released for a 45-day public review period
 - Public and Agencies Comment on Draft EIR
- Final EIR includes Response to Comments, Draft EIR corrections, Mitigation Monitoring Program



Manteca General Plan Update Project









- The General Plan includes the following elements: Land Use (includes Environmental Justice), Circulation, Resource Conservation (combines Open Space, Conservation, and Air Quality), and Safety (includes Climate Adaptation and Noise) as well as optional elements, including Growth Management, Community Design, Economic Development, and Community Facilities and Services.
- The Land Use Map designates the distribution and intensity of residential, commercial, parks, agricultural, public facilities, and other land uses.



Environmental Review









- Manteca's General Plan Update is subject to review under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA).
- A Program-Level Environmental Impact Report (EIR) will be prepared.
- The General Plan has been prepared as a "self-mitigating" document. In other words, policies and actions have been included in the General Plan in order to reduce environmental impacts.

The public has multiple opportunities to provide comments on the environmental analysis:

- During the Notice of Preparation "scoping" process
- During the 45-day Draft EIR comment period
- At public hearings with the Planning Commission and City Council
